Sensitive Habitat Inventory Mapping

Sensitive Habitat Inventory Mapping

was developed by Fisheries and Oceans Canada, as a method to conduct fish and wildlife habitat assessments of freshwater lakes. The information collected includes land use, riparian habitat and existing sensitive fish and wildlife habitats.

Living Lakes Canada and the Stewards of the Lac la Biche Watershed, with support from Lac La Biche County, Alberta Ecotrust, Environment Canada and the Alberta Real Estate Foundation, will be on Lac la Biche between July 9th – 16th, conducting a Sensitive Habitat Inventory Mapping Project.



The information gathered will be used to develop Shoreline Management Guidelines, which will help direct shoreline activities to protect, conserve and restore important fish and wildlife habitats and the water they depend on.

This type of mapping has been done on numerous lakes in British Columbia, the South Basin of Lake Winnipeg, and now, for the first time, in Alberta.
